### 2016 Community Art Exhibition Winners Announced

Tanisha Burtnyk has won the overall prize in the City of Joondalup's 2016 Community Art Exhibition, which was launched on Saturday 11 June at Myer Centre Court, Lakeside Joondalup Shopping City.

Tanisha won for the most outstanding work in any media category for her piece, *Untitled*.

Having previously been staged at the Great Space, this year's exhibition – the 19th time the event has been held – will be displayed across two levels in the foyer outside the Myer Joondalup store, until Saturday 25 June.

Members of the public are encouraged to vote for their favourite artwork in the Popular Choice Award.

The Popular Choice Award winner will receive a \$500.00 prize while another exhibiting artist will be awarded a \$3,000 commission to produce an artwork that will be photographed and printed onto canvas to be displayed on the Inside-Out Billboard.

The 2016 exhibition features the work of 192 artists, all of whom are either residents of the City or members of a non-profit visual arts association within the City.

### Warwick Hockey Centre Works Progressing

Work on the \$6.3million Warwick Hockey Centre is progressing well.

The site at Warwick Open Space has now been cleared, and the footprint of the synthetic playing surface, clubrooms and northern car park has been established.

The Warwick Hockey Centre development will include a clubroom facility, one synthetic and two grass hockey pitches, parking, irrigation, landscaping and floodlighting.

The City committed \$4.5million to the project and received a further \$1.2million from the State Government through its Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund, while Whitford Hockey Club – the tenant at the facility – is contributing \$600,000.

### Funding for CCTV

CCTV and lighting in the Joondalup City Centre will be upgraded as part of the Federal Government's State Safer Streets Program.

Moore MHR Ian Goodenough and Justice Minister Michael Keenan recently visited the Joondalup City Centre to announce that the City had been successful in obtaining funding of \$327,700 for five CCTV cameras and upgraded lighting at several locations throughout the City Centre.

The City is one of only a very small number of local governments using CCTV in public areas that has dedicated staff operating these systems, including live monitoring at high risk times, to report and rectify issues, and work closely with the WA Police.
